Summer Exams – message from Miss Nightingale, Vice Principal

Students in Year 11 will have an assembly next week to remind them of the key aspects for the exam season. They will get their personalised timetables with seat number and locations for each exam. They will also be reminded that they will **need to wear full school uniform for each exam** (as they would every day) including school shoes, blazers and no extra jewellery or false eyelashes/nails. # Masterclasses – message from Miss Nightingale, Vice Principal

Starting on 9<sup>th</sup> May, students in Years 10 and 11 will get an outline of their Masterclass timetable for exams occurring before half term. This is an hour-long session as close to the exam as possible to ensure students are fully prepared, are going into the exam with a can do attitude, and are ready to achieve their best. Students will get personalised timetables sent to them next week with all the details they need of what to attend, where and when. These will be sent to their school email accounts. We will also put the general Masterclass timetable on our website so you can see what is available, and a paper copy will be available outside my office in Middle School.

After half term some departments will continue to run Masterclasses for those who are invited (sometimes this is everyone), in addition to clinics where students are able to access a teacher for a particular subject if they require support or just want to revise that subject with a teacher. A reminder that Year 11 students are required to be in school until Friday 24<sup>th</sup> May, after which time they are only required to attend for the Masterclasses they are invited to and their examinations.

#### Exam Attendance – message from Miss Nightingale, Vice Principal

Last week Mrs Bennett (our Pupil Premium Administrator) sent emails to some parents regarding students bringing their school laptop back into school so we could conduct a health check.
