Following on from the message about the new DfE guidance on mobile phones, we would appreciate if you could provide some feedback on the below short survey by 4pm

on Friday 22 March 2024. We spoke to students about this matter in assemblies this week and are asking both them and staff to also feed back their views.

The first question is about how best to prohibit the use of mobile phones using the four options given to schools by the DfE. In order to then iron out the finer details of the new policy, we are asking for feedback on key considerations to take into account in terms of learning, safety and wellbeing. These three questions are optional so please just answer any where you have ideas you would like us to consider.

The event is underpinned by an ethos of problem solving, resilience, and the development of engineers of the future. This is, quite rightly, the focus of the event and I am proud to say that the Robodeers were awarded the prestigious **golden motivate trophy** for their engineering approach, their ability to adapt under pressure, and for their approach to collaborative science as a whole.

As the robot club goes from strength to strength, our next step will be to extend this fantastic experience to younger students. Who knows, one day we could be introducing our Hinchingbrooke robot to the crowd at the world finals!
