I would like to congratulate, and thank, students for the work they have put into their Teacher Assessed Grade assessments this half term. We are well aware of both the advantages and the challenges of doing multiple assessments, and our students have risen exceptionally well to those challenges! Students in Year 13 and Year 11 have done the most assessments but Year 10 students have also done RPE assessments and a high proportion of our Year 12 students have done assessments, too. Well done to them all, and fingers crossed that the grades awarded reflect the hard work that they have put in.

We now very much look forward to marking the end of Year 11 and Year 13 with our students next half term, through the events we are planning.

COVID-19 Testing and responding to COVID symptoms over the half term break – message from Mr Cooke, Vice-Principal

The government has confirmed that the **Lateral Flow Testing Programme** should continue over the half term break and we envisage that this will continue for the whole of next half term too. Thank you for your efforts to support this important testing programme. Please follow these instructions if your child is participating in the testing programme or develops COVID symptoms:

- Students should test twice a week at home, then report the results online to the school (using the *student's school email address* on **TestRegister.co.uk**) and to the NHS
- If your child has a **positive LFD test result** or **develops COVID symptoms within 2 days of being in school** (i.e. Friday 28 May or Saturday 29 May), the family should start isolating and a confirmatory **PCR test** should be booked as soon as possible
- The result of the PCR test should be reported to the school using <u>communications@hinchbk.cambs.sch.uk</u> marking your email 'Positive COVID-19 case' and the name and Form Class of your child, alongside a telephone number on which the school can contact you to get further details about possible close contacts in school
- If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 after 2 days from last being in school (ie from Sunday 30 May onwards) you should book a PCR test for your child, but in the event of a positive result there is no

need to contact school. Instead, you should notify close contact family and friends and follow advice as per NHS COVID-19 guidelines at: http://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/

COVID Safety Measures in school next half term - message from Mrs Tandy, Vice-Principal

Please remember that some of our COVID safety measures will be changing after half term. The video below talks through the changes, which include <u>only</u> wearing masks when travelling round the site, no longer having the one-way system and no longer needing to wipe down desks at the start of lessons. Whilst there will be some changes, other measures will remain in place next half term, such as having year group zones for break and lunch, separate gates for the start and end of the day, and separate toilet facilities for break and lunch. We will also continue encouraging students to sanitise their hands regularly as this is generally good practice for staying healthy and avoiding different bugs. We will continue to review our safety measures and inform you of any further changes as and when the situation allows. In the meantime, I would appreciate you discussing these safety measures with your child so that they understand what is expected after half term.
