Some of our students have already been entered for a number of their exams early, and yesterday we had some of their results. 79% of the A Level students entered for the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) achieved an A\* or an A - this is a phenomenal achievement! Also, a number of our Year 10 students received their 'Step Up to English' results. Out of the 'Gold' students, 100% of them achieved a Level 3 Gold Award which is really fantastic, and the vast majority entered at Level 2 also achieved the qualification! This is great news for those Year 10 students who now already have a qualification under their belt!


#### The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme - message from Miss Nightingale, Vice-Principal
