# **Year 11 and Year 13 –** message from Ms Nightingale, Vice-Principal

Students have now completed two weeks of the exams season and have done themselves and the school proud!

After half term there are 4 weeks of the exam season left! From 6 June there will **not be any lessons for Years 11 or 13**, but students did receive an email yesterday to invite them to Masterclasses taking place throughout the exam period. If invited, the students are expected to attend, as their class teachers are confident that they will benefit

from this. Their email will state the date, time and location of their Masterclass (only those with room numbers!). I know students will get lots out of these sessions and will also be revising and working hard in their own time.

Year 13 students are more than welcome to continue to study in the House in between exams, or indeed to come into school if this offers a more conducive environment. Year 11 are also welcome to revise in school in between exams and Masterclasses and will find the Food Court available during lesson times, along with a quiet space in the main school library. We are here to support the students through this time as best we can.

This year, a higher number of Year 11 students than ever before are regularly asking to leave the exam hall to use the facilities. We always advise students to only request to use the facilities if they feel it is absolutely necessary, as every minute counts in exams and there is inevitably a small amount of disruption when a student leaves an exam, which is exacerbated if a large number ask to leave. We would be grateful if you could reiterate this message to your child about only asking to leave if it is absolutely necessary. If you have a child currently in Year 11 and there is a medical condition we are not already aware of which would mean toilet breaks are essential for your child, please do contact the Student Support Officer to tell us. Thank you for your support in this matter and indeed for the support you are giving both your child and the school during this important time.

#### Parent/Carer Focus Group

# **Tackling vaping in school -** a message from Mrs Tandy, Vice-Principal

We are aware of the ongoing problem of vaping in and around our school site, which although it involves only a very small proportion of our students, is having a negative impact on the community. Despite our efforts to stop it happening, the problem is continuing, so we will be changing our approach from after May half term.

We operate a zero-tolerance approach to vaping: it is never acceptable to vape, or be involved in vaping activity, in our school. So, we intend to apply sanctions as described below if we believe, on the balance of probability, that a student has been involved in vaping activity. 'Being involved' includes being in possession of vaping paraphernalia and/or choosing to be in a group among which we believe vaping has taken place – for example, if there were two or three students in a toilet cubicle where vaping is very likely to have taken place, they will all receive a sanction. As you may imagine, it is actually very hard to catch someone in the act of vaping – it is often done in the toilet cubicles – which is why we intend to apply sanctions on the balance of probability. Typical sanctions will include:

- First instance of vaping or involvement in vaping activity = an SLT after-school detention
- Second instance = Day out of mainstream lessons in the school's 'Blue Room'
- Third instance = 2-day suspension

Any repeated instances of vaping after the suspension stage are likely to result in a further escalation in sanctions, as decided by the Principal and Vice-Principal, since repeated instances of the same behaviour represent defiance, which the school will not tolerate.

It is important to us that every student at Hinchingbrooke feels they can use the toilets at break and lunchtime without coming into contact with this sort of unacceptable activity, and this is the main reason why we are toughening our approach. We intend to communicate this very clear message about vaping activity to students from the first week after half term, which is why we want to ensure you are also aware of the plans now. If you are aware that your child vapes and they would like to seek support to give up, this is something we can arrange through Healthy Schools Cambridgeshire. Please contact the Student Support Officer for your child's year group to discuss in the first instance.

Please support us in our zero-tolerance approach.

Once again please accept our gratitude and appreciation for those who have been able to assist our students in finding work placements – given the ever-changing economic and work environments, to have over 90% of the year group placed is a fantastic achievement. Thank you.

#### Activities for those without a Full Placement

To assist with students unable to find an opportunity for all or part of the two weeks, we have put together a series of careers-based activities to cover the entire period. These are available on Teams in the assignment section and on the main channel of the Year 10 Work Experience folder. There are webinars, live employer interaction opportunities (some need to be signed into and booked prior to the session, so please allow plenty of time), videos, blogs, podcasts and a number of interactive resources available to all students, parents/carers. Additionally, I would encourage all students to explore the resources above as there are some very useful materials available allowing everyone to gain an insight into a variety of career pathways/job roles. While on placement students are expected to complete the **Work Experience Booklet** their tutor has allocated to them. This will also form part of the tutorial activities upon return to school.

Early in Year 11 students will be encouraged to begin thinking about their Post-16 options and these two weeks can have a major impact on that decision-making process so once again thank you very much for helping to make it happen.
