Response to Ukraine Humanitarian Crisis – message from Mrs Black, Associate Principal and Deputy Head of Sixth Form



On Wednesday this week, the humanitarian donations that our community made to support the people of Ukraine were collected from school. The driver was amazed by the generosity of our community and had to make three trips to their storage facility!

Today the packages are being transported to Peterborough and early next week a lorry will take them to Poland, where they will be distributed to those in need. Once again, a massive thank you to everyone who supported this initiative!

COVID-19 update

The number of positive cases among HBK students has risen over the past week: yesterday, we had 58 positive cases, which is up from the average of around 45 last week. There are 13 members of staff absent with COVID today, too, and staff absence inevitably has some impact on the smooth running of the school. The recent rise in positive cases of COVID reflects a national trend, which will hopefully lessen as a result of the break that the Easter holiday will create.

Music Festival Grand Final! Wow!



It was my privilege to attend the Grand Final on Wednesday night! We were treated to performances from the winners in the five classes from the huge number of performances that had taken place during the school day on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday this week. The standard was very high, and the format of the event was competitive – we had three adjudicators (including our very own Mrs Nichols!) who assessed each piece and who, at the end, spoke about each one, as well as deciding – agonisingly - on the three winners. The adjudicators were thrilled by what they saw and heard, as were all of us who made up the audience! Behaviour this week - message from Mrs Tandy

Following on from my recent ParentMail message about vaping, unfortunately a very small number of students have persisted with bringing and using vapes in school, for which suspensions have been put in place this week. Furthermore, we had an incident yesterday where a small group of students made a very poor choice around banned substances on their way to school, which again has resulted in suspensions being put in place for everybody involved. Behaviour of this kind is not welcome in our school, and please be assured that we are taking assertive action when students make what we view as very poor choices that compromises the safety of our community and/or breaches our school rules.

Of course, these incidents are representative of only a very small proportion of our students, and I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all of our many other students who continue to excel each and every day. Indeed, it has been wonderful acknowledging the efforts of so many students in our Celebration Assemblies this week as part of our 'Easter Eggstravaganza'.

Easter School 2022 – message from Ms Nightingale, Vice-Principal

All students in Years 11 and 13 need to ensure that they get a break over the holiday, but it is also essential that they make a revision plan and use the time wisely. We are now just 8 weeks away from the start of the exam season!

Regular Retrieval Practice (5-a-day) – message from Ms Nightingale, Vice-Principal

Retrieving information is best achieved through regular practice and in the run up to the 2022 public examinations this has never been more true. In order to support your child through this process and encourage them, from Monday 28 March we will be sending through 5 questions a day you can ask your Year 11 child. These 5-a-day questions will cover English, Maths and all 3 Sciences, and - just as importantly – we will provide the answers for you! One suggestion is that you ask the questions at dinner time, or at another convenient time (maybe during drop-off or pick-up). This is, of course, meant as a supportive measure to check knowledge but also to offer you a structured opportunity to talk to your child about their schoolwork - do encourage them to talk to their teachers if there are areas they are still struggling with. Give it a go and let us know how it goes!
