#### HBK's Mission, Values and Key Focuses from September 2021

#### **Student Survey -** message from Mrs Tandy, Vice-Principal

We conducted our student survey across all year groups earlier this half term. Despite last year's student survey results being very positive, we were delighted to see even better results across three quarters of the questions asked this year. The areas where we have seen the greatest improvement since last year are in the reporting and resolution of bullying and discriminatory events. Furthermore, the number of students experiencing bullying or discrimination has dropped since last year according to our students. There has been a significant improvement in the questions about Hinchingbrooke encouraging better physical health and better emotional wellbeing and mental health. We have also seen an increase in the questions about encouraging students to be independent and take on responsibility. Finally, there has been a significant improvement in the question about providing students with information about their next steps. There were a number of other questions where the results were better than last year so overall we are very pleased with these results and grateful to the students for their positive feedback.

As part of our follow up work from the survey, year teams have met with individual students where any concerns were flagged. For example, if any student said they did not feel safe, there has been a follow-up discussion to unpack this. Furthermore, any student who said they had been bullied or experienced discrimination but not reported it has also been spoken to individually to encourage them to use the school processes to access support, ensure the matter is dealt with by the school, and to ensure that the issue is not ongoing. It is important that students can see our immediate response to the answers they have given on the survey and that they know how valued their voice is. Indeed, both their views and the views of parents mentioned last week will inform our future planning to ensure continued improvement.
