I understand that a number of parents of new HBK students have recently been added to our ParentMail: welcome!

Early school finish for all students on 29 September 2022

The school will close at 1.20pm on 29 September, so that staff can prepare for the Sixth Form Open Evening that will start at 5pm on the day. Breaktime will be extended on the day, to run from 11am to 11.30am, to allow students to get a more

substantial meal. Students will be dismissed at 1.20pm and the HBK school buses / taxis will be arranged to take them home at this time. As usual, if this is inconvenient for any HBK families, and you would prefer your child to remain at school until 3.15, please contact your child's Student Support Officer to say this, and we will make arrangements to supervise your child until 3.15. Do please note, however, that if your child usually gets the school bus at 3.15, you will need to make an alternative arrangement for this one day; we do apologise for any inconvenience this may cause you.

Year 7 Cashless Lunch Payment System - message from Mr Milner, Head of Year 7

Thank you to the parents of Year 7 students for your patience as we have been working on fixing a problem with the school cashless catering system. Our Year 7 students are now on the biometric system but, unfortunately, due to a technical error, any funds added to ParentPay are not being synchronised to the cashless system. So, we have added an overdraft facility to our students' accounts on the cashless system, that will enable them to purchase food and drink using their thumbprint in the biometric system. As soon as the Synchronisation facility is enabled, we will let you know. If you prefer, your child can continue to use cash until the cashless system issue is resolved.

In the meantime, please accept our apologies for any inconvenience that this causes.

Teaching and Learning – message from Ms Solvar-Isida, Assistant Principal

Welcome to another exciting year of teaching and learning at HBK! It was great to see our new Year 7 students, and pleasing too to see all of our other students back looking refreshed and ready for - hopefully - a more settled year this year! We have now given out a new set of Knowledge Organiser Folders and Self-Quizzing Exercise

Books to all years 7-11 students. Previous sets must be kept safely at home, as teachers will be expecting students to go back to previous learning at various times during the year - this is the principle of retrieval practice and what

we believe, at Hinchingbrooke, to be the number 1 strategy for effective retention of learning. Just a quick reminder of some **key expectations** to ensure a positive start to the year:

- 1. KO folders and SQ Books are part of the **daily essential equipment**, so students must bring them to school everyday
- 2. **Homework** is a compulsory part of our educational provision and therefore must be completed to a high standard and on time
- 3. For the Self-Quizzing Homework, here are the **expected standards**:

Good presentation
work is presented neatly
date and title are written
and underlined

Repeat

Self-quizzing is done at
least twice (repeat of
sections -not just words)

Checks

Work is checked with a
green pen

Gorrections

Corrections are made with
a green pen
