Exams and Masterclasses – update from Miss Nightingale, Vice Principal

A reminder that Year 11 students no longer have to attend lessons after half term. They just need to come in for their Masterclasses and exams. All information can be found on the website regarding the Masterclass offer. A reminder that students have also had their Masterclass invites sent to their school email address, and this tells then when and where the masterclasses they have been invited to take place.

Year 10

Straight after half term the Year 10 will have exams. These will take place in classrooms and students will have been told by their class teachers when these will take place and what they need to revise. A reminder that revision should be active. We suggest using GCSEPod to watch pods on the topics students feel uncertain about, and then to complete a check and challenge to show how much they understand.

Also watch out for the letter about Summer Tuition. There are 2 opportunities for students to sign up to tutoring over the summer holidays. We did something similar 2 years ago and over 130 students got involved. The reviews were great and the students started Year 11 with greater confidence and a really fantastic work ethic which paid off when it came to results. If you want your child to get involved look out for the letter which will have a link to a sign up sheet and have a conversation to make sure they are on board!


Year 12 Exams

Teaching & Learning – update from Mrs Lombard, Assistant Principal

Teachers are making wide use of the mini whiteboards that all main school students were provided with at the beginning of the year.

These are often used to support students in reviewing their learning and retrieving their knowledge, but, teachers use them as a tool for so much



more. Such as, checking students understanding during the lesson and asking questions of every student.

All these elements are key parts of the Hinchingbrooke Approach to Teaching and ensuring not only are students exposed to knowledge and application of it, but that they remember it and can recall it.

Some teachers, however, have reported that a growing number of students appear not to have their mini whiteboards with them in lessons. This will impact both their learning and the ability of teachers to check their understanding.

Therefore, please could I ask parents/carers of students in years 7-10 to check with your child over half term that they have their mini whiteboard and are bringing them into school everyday. It is part of their equipment.

If your child does not have one for any reason please can they let their form tutor know when we return from the break.
