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### **Year 11 and 13 Laptops** – message from Miss Nightingale, Vice-Principal

There are a number of students who have been loaned a laptop at some stage during their career at Hinchingbrooke School and still have these at home to help with their studies. Of course, we encourage the use of these devices until the end of the exam season to access GCSEPod, Bitesize and various other quality revision sites. At the end of this period, we would ask the students to make a decision regarding their device. Students can keep their laptop and use it for their next steps (Sixth Form or college) for a nominal amount of £50 or they can return the device to us via School Reception by Friday 8<sup>th</sup> July 2022. There will be an option on Parentpay later in the year should your child decide to keep their device. For those who decide to return their laptop we ask that they bring it in to Reception, with their name and Form clearly visible alongside the laptop, by the 8<sup>th</sup> July deadline. Thank you.

# **Examinations and Masterclasses -** message from Miss Nightingale, Vice-Principal

Thank you for your patience whilst we set up the Masterclasses – it has been a huge undertaking, but one we feel will be thoroughly worthwhile. All Masterclasses **before half term are compulsory** and will help the students to get in the right frame of mind to go into the exam and perform at their best. Year 11 students will leave their timetabled lessons for the relevant Masterclasses, whilst Year 13 Masterclasses take place in the last lesson of the relevant subject before a paper (so if the History exam is Wednesday afternoon, then the Masterclass will either be Tuesday or Wednesday morning depending on the timetable). Year 13 students **will not miss other lessons** for their Masterclasses.

After half term the Masterclasses will continue for invited/targeted students. These are those students the subject teachers believe will benefit most — and on many occasions this is all of the students studying a specific subject. Students will receive a letter to inform them which sessions they have been invited to. It will also state

when and where the Masterclass will take place. If students have been invited to a Masterclass the expectation is that they attend.

The formal examinations start on Monday (16<sup>th</sup> May) with Year 10 RPE being the first 'into the breech'. With 4 year groups involved in the live exams, our exams team do an amazing job to ensure that all students get the access arrangements to which they are entitled and try their very best to ensure that students with extreme anxiety are looked after. There have been some late requests regarding rooms students sit in and the location within the exams room. Unless a student has a medical note giving a clear reason why such requests are necessary then we regret that such requests cannot be met.

Students are well prepared for the season ahead and we wish them every success in the next few weeks where they will show us what they can do. We continue to be here to support them in their last few steps. We are HBK!

### Year 9 Exams

Students in Year 9 will have their exams straight after half term. These will take place in classrooms in the week beginning 6<sup>th</sup> June. Students will have revision tasks to complete to help prepare them for these exams. Also, they have access to a wonderful video revision site, 'GCSEPod'. There are videos for nearly all the subjects we study here at Hinchingbrooke School, so it is definitely worth asking your Year 9 child if they are using it as part of their revision timetable.

### Year 12 Exams

Year 12 exams will be taking place between **Thursday 23 June and Friday 1 July**. Students will be expected to be in lessons up to and including Wednesday 22 June, after which students will only attend their exams. The exams timetable is on the website for your convenience Year 12 Exams Timetable

# Year 9 Exam Access Arrangements – message from Mr Sedgwick, SENDCo

Exam Access Arrangements: During the next two weeks all year 9 students will conduct an initial screening to identify who may qualify for any additional exam access arrangements, such as extra time or access to technology, which will apply to their GCSE formal examinations. This initial screening is a straightforward process which is completed online and will take place within one lesson. Once the results have been processed, we will be in touch to discuss individual results and next steps for the students who may qualify.
