Dear Parents and Carers

The Government has announced that secondary schools should have a phased return of students next term, to help limit the spread of COVID-19 in the immediate after-Christmas period by creating a partial COVID-19 'fire break', and to allow schools some time to get started with planning for voluntary COVID-19 rapid testing at school. At the moment, a lot remains unclear about the voluntary COVID-19 testing that might be done in schools, but we will update you on this when we can; for now, we intend to follow the Government's guidance about how next term should start.

From Monday 4 January

Students in Year 11 and Year 13 should return to school as normal from 4 January.

Students who are the children of 'key workers' and students designated as

'vulnerable' may also return to school <u>from 4 January</u>. If your child falls into one of these two categories – please check the up to date definitions of key worker and vulnerable which can be found in the information on the form that is linked below - please complete the form at the link below and submit it by <u>5pm on 31 December 2020</u>; this will enable us to know who else, apart from Year 11 and Year 13 students, to expect in school <u>from 4 January</u>. In the case of the children of key workers, please only send your child to school in the week <u>4-8 January</u> where it is essential to enable you to work, as the COVID-19 'fire break' will be most effective if the number of students in school is as low as possible. All other students will be working from home from Monday 4 to Friday 8 January and they should follow their normal school timetable. Year 12s will receive work in the same way that they have during the Autumn term (e.g. email or Teams). For Years 7 to 10 new work and/or instructions will be uploaded onto Doddle each day for the 5 lessons. Some of the lessons will be delivered live by teachers using Microsoft Teams, for all or part of the lesson. Teachers who intend to provide live access to lessons using Microsoft Teams will inform your child on Doddle and send an invitation to their school email address. Free school meals provision during the week 4-8 January

We are currently seeking clarification from the Cambridgeshire Local Authority about whether the Winter Voucher Scheme that is operating over the Christmas holidays will be extended to include the week of 4-8 January. We will update you on this over the holiday.

From Monday 11 January

We are currently expecting all students to be back in school from this date.

Mass testing programme

We are positive about the potential for the mass testing of students and staff in schools, as a way of reducing the spread of the virus and enabling fewer students and staff to have to self-isolate. At this stage, we are not envisaging having a programme of mass testing up and running as the spring term starts, but we will write to you again with more details as soon as we can, alongside any further updates on school/lessons; this is clearly a very fluid situation and we thank parents and carers for your understanding.
