Update on Remote Learning – from Mr Cooke, Vice-Principal

As we are now embarking on Remote Learning until February half-term, please be aware that there is a section on the school's website containing relevant information, such as: help videos on how to access Teams (the Microsoft app which we are using for delivering live lessons); guidelines for students and parents about remote learning, including expectations of students during live lessons – these have been updated recently to reflect our increased use of Teams; guidance on educational websites which departments use and how to get help with passwords. The school's expectation is that teachers will be delivering live lessons to students in all year groups from Monday 11 January, and recording their attendance at these lessons. If students can attend their online lessons on time, that will be great. Some lessons may be 100% live, whilst others may just include a live element – that will depend, clearly, on what the teacher has planned. Teachers are doing their very best to get themselves to a point where live lessons work well and, as you can hopefully appreciate, some are currently further along the remote learning journey than others; we very much appreciate your understanding of the challenges involved.

Update on Doddle – from Mr Pendlebury, Assistant Principal

Unfortunately, the Doddle app is currently offline. This is because Doddle are doing an update because the Flash player which is used for some of their resources is now defunct - they have had to come up with a new plug-in to allow these resources to work, and that has meant removing their app temporarily. Part of a message we have seen recently from Doddle includes this sentence: 'On Monday 11th January some big changes are coming to Doddle.' For now, this issue is out of our hands as we have no control over the updates that Doddle do, and we were unaware that their app was going to be unavailable for this period. I appreciate parents' frustration and apologise for the inconvenience of this situation - the

Vulnerable and Key Worker School – from Ms Nightingale, Vice-Principal

A reminder that if you are a key worker (definitions as outlined by the government) or your child is vulnerable (has an EHCP or a social worker) then you are entitled to sign up to the Hinchingbrooke Vulnerable and Key Worker School from 11th January. To sign up you need to complete the form (link below) by 5pm on Thursday 7th January. **We would ask that you <u>only</u> sign up if you need a place**. Students who access this facility will be in a computer room all day and be able to access their lessons through Doddle and Teams. If your child is in attendance this week, then you do not need to complete the form again. If you have requested a place by email or told you are on a waiting list, please complete this form to show your need.
