


Fifty Contemporary Choreographers by Martha Bremser & Lorna Sanders



Dame Marie Rambert was a Polish-Jewish dancer and dance pedagogue who exerted a great influence on British ballet, both as a dancer and teacher.






Matthew Bourne and his adventures in dance by Alistair Macaulay

In 1996, Adventures in Motion Pictures made history as the

first modern dance company to open a production in London's West End, guided by Artistic Director Matthew Bourne. In his early works - Spitfire, Town & Country and Deadly Serious - Bourne brought a novel approach to dance. And in his reworkings of the classics of the ballet canon – Nutcracker, Swan Lake, Cinderella - Bourne created witty, vivid, poignant productions that received great acclaim.
