Preparation for A Level Music 2021-2023

1. Theory

- If you haven't passed Grade 5 ABRSM Theory, you need to buy the book:
- You need to complete as much as possible in the book as you will be entered for the exam at the start of the course
- If you have already passed Grade 5 theory, why not start Grade 6, 7 or 8?

2. Listening

- Listen to a wide range of music, particularly from the Baroque, Classical and
 Romantic eras. Classic fm is a great source <u>www.classicfm.com</u>, or access the BBC Proms on the iPlayer
- Whilst listening, take note of instrumentation, structure, texture, timbre, rhythm, melody and any other point of interest. Please create a listening log to keep track of what you have heard
- Access some 'live' music events over the Summer there is plenty going on, from various orchestras such as the London Symphony Orchestra

3. Performing

- You will need to produce a 6-minute performance (solo or ensemble, any style, any instrument) of at least Grade 6 standard during Year 12. Start to have a think about what you might perform.
- Practice your instrument daily. Make sure it is **quality** practice, rather than for a 'set' amount of time.
- If you don't have a private instrumental/vocal teacher, please get one!

4. Composing

- Have a go at creating some melodies in different keys
- Think about the phrase structure, key, melodic shape, modulation etc.
- Don't let anything hold you back be creative and you might even end up with a full piece by the end of the summer!

5. <u>Edexcel</u>

- Familiarise yourself with the NEW Edexcel syllabus <u>www.edexcel.com</u>. Please **read** the specification!
- Buy the Edexcel Music anthology https://www.amazon.co.uk/Edexcel-Level-Anthology-Music-2016 to familiarise yourself with the set works. There are recordings of all of the set works online, you do not need to buy the CDs.
