
Student and Parent / Carer Surveys Autumn 2022





OVERVIEW OF ALL SURVEYS

Hinchingbrooke's Senior Leadership Team met in January 2023 to discuss all the survey results, both as individual surveys and also looking at trends across all stakeholders. Our objective is to use the survey results to further improve the school:

Student Survey

Students were generally positive about teachers helping them to do their best and setting work that challenges them. There could be some more survey preparation work with students ahead of the summer survey as some of the Ofsted questions are ambiguous in their meaning, so we need to clarify these for students. In the student survey more students are now reporting bullying or discrimination when these happen (compared to the 2022 surveys), however, a smaller proportion of students than in the previous survey feel the issues are fully resolved, which needs addressing. There was also a slight decrease in the number of students who say they feel safe, which year teams are already following up with individual students. When questioned about this last year, a lot of the students spoken to said that Covid had had a negative impact on them feeling safe in school, so the issue then was one that was somewhat beyond the school's control. It will be interesting to see whether this is still the case this year or whether other reasons are cited. Most students are proud of being at Hinchingbrooke and enjoy school, although again we will talk to individuals who do not enjoy school to understand why this is and to see whether there is anything the school can do to help them feel more positive about it. Students are proud to be part of the HBK community. They believe that Hinchingbrooke encourages respect, and a high percentage would recommend the school to a friend. The key areas for consideration/development are around the new behaviour system, improving behaviour in general, helping all students to enjoy school and students feeling issues are fully resolved when reported.

Parent / Carer Survey

With parents and carers, the most pleasing area of improvement in terms of positive responses was to the question 'The school makes me aware of what my child will study' as we have done a lot of work on this in response to previous, more negative survey responses in this area. There were also positive responses to the questions around having high expectations, children doing well at this school, letting parents and carers know how their child is doing and the range of subjects available, presenting an overall very positive picture in terms of both the curriculum, teaching, and learning. Interestingly the percentage of parents and carers agreeing that the school ensures its pupils are well behaved was lower than in the Autumn 2022 survey, yet a third of parents and carers gave a negative response to the question around the new behaviour system which aims to improve behaviour – this is something we will need to try to tease out, and it may be related to the fact that the behaviour changes are very recent and have not had much time as yet to 'bed in'. A high proportion of parents and carers say their child/children are happy, feel safe, enjoy school, are very positive about the curriculum and would recommend the school to others.

Overall

In terms of academic success, there is generally a positive trajectory across all surveys with positive responses compared to previous years, which is really pleasing. The new behaviour system is currently being reviewed considering both the survey responses in this document and the student REP feedback that was discussed at the end of the Autumn term. With a change as big as this (i.e. The new behaviour system), a degree of uncertainty and even negativity may be predictable as it is still 'early days'; it will be interesting to see whether some of the questions around the new system are responded to differently in the Summer 2023 surveys. Overall, there are consistencies across all surveys in terms of pride in the school and the strength of the community values at Hinchingbrooke but there is a lack of confidence from a small proportion of parents, carers, and students around the effectiveness of the new behaviour system at this time.

STUDENT SURVEY - 1,360 Responses

Responses to the student survey were significantly higher than last year (1,360 compared to an average of 950 across the two surveys last year) making them more representative of the student view, although in many cases figures were very much in line with those from previous surveys. Positive responses were up in fourteen out of the twenty-three questions compared to June (three were the same and six had less positive responses) and more positive responses in eight categories compared to November 2021 (one the same and fourteen lower). The comparisons against June are reasonably similar to the staff survey, however compared to November 2021, the picture from students is less negative than that from the staff survey.

Compared to the June 2022 survey the most significant increase in positive responses is to the question about behaviour (+9%). Interestingly responses to the new question on whether the Arbor system would improve behaviour over time showed less than a third of students responding positively, with almost half giving a negative response. This suggests that students do not necessarily see the new behaviour system as having had an impact on behaviour, and possibly reflects the fact that behaviour generally tends to be better at the start of the academic year.

Although there were eight categories which saw more positive responses compared to the November 2021 survey, the majority of these were only very small increases. The biggest increase in positive responses was that more students who had experienced bullying reported this (+9%) even though the number experiencing bullying remained almost the same. However, comparing the current survey to June 2022, the biggest drops in positive responses concerned whether reporting instances of bullying resolved the matter (-7% for bullying). The same is true comparing the current survey to November 2021 in relation to whether reporting incidents of prejudice led to a resolution (-22%). One other noteworthy comparison between the current survey and November 2021 is that positive responses to the question about recommending the school have dropped by 10%. This figure is far higher than any drop in questions relating to enjoying, feeling proud of or enjoying learning at HBK, suggesting that for some students there are other reasons for not recommending the school beyond general enjoyment.

The question allowing students to state their favourite thing about Hinchingbrooke elicited a wide range of responses. It is pleasing to see that the top three most cited aspects are the school's facilities and site, teachers and the quality of teaching, and the quality of the curriculum and enjoyment of lessons.

In terms of the question that allowed students to comment on why they felt the new behaviour system would or would not improve behaviour over time, although the most frequently made comment related to the system being too strict, there were also a high number of comments praising the clarity and fairness of the new system, as well as offering more balanced views that acknowledged its strengths, while expressing a feeling that it would not lead to improved behaviour from all students.

PARENT/CARER SURVEY NOVEMBER 2022 – 391 RESPONSES

It was pleasing to have so many more responses to the current survey: 391 responses compared with 117 responses in November 2021 and 77 responses in June 2022. Compared to last year's surveys, positive responses were up in eight categories compared to June 2022 and were up in nine compared to November 2021. Positive responses decreased in five categories compared to November 2021 and in four compared to June 2022 (two were the same). The biggest increase in positive responses was in the question 'The school supports my child's wider personal development' which was up by 28% compared to June 2022 and 23% compared to November 2021, closely followed by the question 'The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year' which was up by 27% compared to June 2022 and by 25% compared to November 2021. This is interesting given that communication was one of the areas flagged up in the comments section later in the survey.

In the question 'The school has high expectations for my child' positive responses were up by 12% compared to June 2022 and 10% compared to November 2021 and in the question 'The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved' positive responses were up by 13% compared to June 2022 but 5% lower than in November 2021. This is interesting given that behaviour and the behaviour system was frequently cited as a negative in parent and carer comments. However one of the problems of trying to categorise 400-odd comments for ease of presentation is that the nuance of many of these comments is lost. Many of the negative comments on behaviour and the behaviour system were related to specific aspects or behaviours rather than criticising the whole system. For example parents and carers supported the tougher stance on disruption to learning but felt that the perceived focus on other aspects such as uniform and equipment was over zealous. At this relatively early stage following the introduction of the new behaviour system, 40% of parents and carers believe that it will improve behaviour over time with a further 29% being unsure at this stage. In short, the overall impression is that our approach to behaviour is heading in the right direction but still requires some work.

Of the small number of questions where positive responses decreased compared to either June 2022 or November 2021 the vast majority saw only small changes. For example responses to the questions around children feeling happy and safe. Similarly the question 'My child does well at this school' was down 4% compared to June 2022 but was up 5% compared to November 2021. As these changes are all relatively small and the number of respondents were so much lower last year, these differences are negligible. In the question about recommending the school to another parent or carer positive responses have gone down 5% compared to June 2022 and 8% compared to November 2021, however negative responses to this question have also decreased (15% in June 2022 compared to 13% now) suggesting that some parents and carers, particularly those new to the school, feel it is too early to say. Similarly uncertainty over the new behaviour system may also have encouraged some parents and carers to move from a positive to a more neutral response.

Where parents and carers were able to make comments, the new behaviour system featured heavily and not just for the question specifically linked to this. While there were many comments focusing on the feeling that the new system is too focused on punishing 'good' students for minor indiscretions, there were an equal number of comments praising the way in which Arbor allowed parents and carers to see positive and negative incidents in 'real time' and therefore be more engaged in supporting the school and their child. The clarity of the system and focus on rewards were also cited as positives. Where parents and carers were able to add detail to their response to the question about Hinchingbrooke being a good school, the most frequent answer was a very general positive statement however over 50 comments cited the happiness of the student as the main reason for thinking that HBK is a good school. For the final question which invited parents and carers to make any further comments, many used this as an opportunity to reiterate negative comments that had been previously made. However 18 comments did give a general thank you to the school.
