
Student and Parent/Carer Surveys Summer 2023





STUDENT SURVEY – 1,047 Responses (1,360 responses in November 2022)

Responses to the student survey were significantly higher than last year (an average of 1,204 compared to an average of 950 across the two surveys last year) making them more representative of the student view, although in many cases figures were very much in line with those from previous surveys.

In overall terms positive responses from students are down compared to both November 2022 and June 2022. The biggest reduction in positives were in the questions 'I enjoy learning at this school' down 10% compared to November 2022 and down 7% compared to June 2022, and 'I feel proud to be a Hinchingbrooke student' down 8% compared to November 2022 and down 7% compared to June 2022. Responses to the statement 'Behaviour is good at HBK' were less positive compared to November 2022 (down 9%), but the same as this time last year (a pattern seen from previous years). The fact that we are maintaining similar outlooks on behaviour year on year is significant given the consistent media messaging that behaviour in schools is deteriorating.

Significant positives include the fact that, while overall numbers of students experiencing bullying or prejudice have remained broadly similar to last year, students are far more likely to report this and, in the case of bullying, this has led to more issues being resolved.

Although positive responses to the question about feeling safe at school have gone down slightly compared to both November 2022 and June 2022, Hinchingbrooke's average figure of 75% is well in excess of the DfE National Behaviour Survey figure of 41%.

While student responses may appear more negative, the school's expectations and the standards we are holding them to have risen this year and this may have led to students feeling less positive about their experience of school. This is a matter to be further explored through student forums and REP meetings next year.

Student comments on the behaviour system contained some interesting aspects. There was a significant increase in the number of students who felt that the behaviour system was having a positive impact on some students (129 comments versus 51 in November 2022). Far fewer students commented that the system was too strict (156 versus 341 in November 2022). However student comments still picked out the fairness and consistency of the system as the biggest areas for concern, something reflected also in the parent / carer survey.

PARENTS/CARERS SURVEY JUNE 2023 – 242 RESPONSES

It was pleasing to have so many more responses to this year's surveys: 391 (242 in summer- average 317) responses compared with 117 responses in November 2021 and 77 responses in June 2022 (average 97).

Overall responses were a little less positive when comparing June 2023 to November 2022, however responses were more positive in comparison to this time last year. We might expect the reduction in positive views over the course of the year, but it is very pleasing to see that in general parents and carers are happier with the school now than they were in June 2022. Some significant areas of improvement include the question 'The school lets me know how my child is doing' where positive responses more than doubled when comparing November 2022 (37%) to November 2023 (76%) and even more impressively saw a small increase over the course of this year to 78% in June 2023. This is interesting as there were some negative comments made regarding how informative reports were; it may be that much of this positive feeling comes from regular parental engagement with the Arbor app rather than reporting / parents' evenings.

Another significant increase in positive responses was for the question 'The school supports my child's wider personal development' which increased from 57% to 80% comparing November 2022 and November 2023, and maintained a strong positive response to the end of this year (76%). This could be the result of work around promoting the different aspects of personal development opportunities available with students and parents / carers centred around a new logo.

The biggest reduction in positive comments was for the question 'The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year' which dropped from 71% in November 2022 to 59% in June 2023. However the figures from 2021 to 2022 were much lower than either of these figures (46% in November 2021 and 44% in June 2022), suggesting that the messaging around curriculum has improved significantly, however more perhaps need to be done to reinforce these messages across the year.

In terms of additional comments to the question around the behaviour system, previously the biggest criticism was the fact the system focused too much on minor issues however parents' and carers' biggest concern now seems to be centred around the lack of flexibility in the system and indeed there are far fewer negative comments overall on the behaviour system. Changes to the categorisation of certain negative behaviours seem to have gone down well with parents and carers, and this is reflected in some positive comments to this effect. One aspect that has been raised in the current survey, that perhaps understandably wasn't present earlier in the year, regards a feeling that sanctions are not always applied consistently by staff. However this is still a small number of negative comments and is balanced by the positive comments regarding being able to see everything that has been recorded.

In terms of the final two opportunities for parents and carers to make additional comments, it was pleasing to see the number of generally positive comments remaining consistent with November 2022 for two reasons. Firstly there is a general trend towards parents and carers becoming less positive over the year and secondly there were significantly fewer responses to the June survey. Another pleasing aspect emerging from these comments is the significant reduction in parents and carers making negative comments regarding communication from the school.
