
Student and Parent/Carer Survey

Summer 2022









SURVEY OVERVIEW

Although the questions on the different surveys are all slightly different, there are several key areas that can be compared:

- Staff and parents/carers were broadly in agreement in terms of their view on whether students were safe at the school. Student responses were slightly lower, however only 5% of students said they felt unsafe (compared to 11% from the parent/carer survey)
- Staff had a more positive opinion on the level of challenge given to students compared to parents/carers and students. However, the student survey showed the lowest negative response to this question (5%) suggesting that students were perhaps either less aware of whether they were being challenged or not compared to staff and parents/carers, or felt that the level of challenge was about right and did not want this to increase further
- Students appear most positive in relation to the question on bullying with 77% reporting not to have experienced any, compared with parents/carers (66% reporting that their child had not been bullied)
- The question on student behaviour is the one area where there are the biggest differences in response between the three groups. Staff were most positive followed by parents/carers and then students. However, staff and student negative responses were similar, whereas parents/carers were far more negative suggesting that the perception of those outside of school was more negative than those in school
- Comparing student and parent/carer responses to the question on enjoying school, we see again that students were less positive but similarly negative, suggesting that students are more likely to say, 'neither agree nor disagree'. A similar trend can be seen for the question of recommending the school to others (student 62% positive but only 7% negative; parents/carers 77% positive but 15% negative). This may be partly due to the change from 'neither agree nor disagree' to 'don't know' in the parent/carer survey
- Comparing the current June 2022 survey with the one from 2020/21, there are some interesting results. The question of student behaviour has seen a big change for all three groups with positives down for staff by 12%, students by 10% and parents/carers by 41% (possibly influenced by the change to the category wording, as above, but the fall from 92% in 20/21 to 69 % and 51% this year suggests this is a more definite trend). Student responses to the other comparable questions are reasonably consistent. Staff responses show a small decrease in positives regarding student safety and dealing with bullying but an increase in positives to the level of challenge. Parents and carers, however, are less positive with regards to challenge (88% positive down to 66%), reasonably similar for the question on bullying and a bit more negative about safety. Overall behaviour is the issue that appears to be most consistently coming up as less positive across all three groups and this will be addressed by changes to the Hinchingbrooke Approach to Behaviour being launched in September.



- Overall students have been less positive than in the December 2021 survey, with the exception of the questions on participating in extra-curricular activities and about having the opportunity to consider next steps / careers advice. While this may represent a cause for concern, as this is the first time that we have surveyed students twice in an academic year, we do not know whether this may represent a standard trend
- Although almost all questions saw a reduction in positive responses, none of these were by more than 9%, with the question on the school encouraging students to look after their emotional and mental health seeing the biggest fall. Of the other questions, five saw falls of less than 5% and given that this survey had more students responding, it may be that changes in responses reflect the larger number of students taking part rather than a decline in satisfaction
- The most positive response was to the question about encouraging students to respect people from other backgrounds and treating people equally (87% positive), followed by the question about students feeling safe and the question about having an adult in school to talk to (both 77%). All three of these questions also featured in the top three most positive responses in the previous December 2021 survey demonstrating a level of consistency in these areas
- The least positive response was the question about student behaviour with only 28% of students expressing a positive opinion. This question was the lowest previously, however the positive response rate has dropped further. This statistic will be cited when launching the new Hinchingbrooke Approach to Behaviour in September 2022
- The frequency with which students are reading independently has remained broadly similar, which is encouraging as there has not been the same drop seen in other questions
- The questions on Knowledge Organisers and the HAT show a drop in positive responses with 9% fewer students expressing a positive opinion of the impact of Knowledge Organisers and 14% fewer students expressing a positive opinion and 10% more students responding negatively to the question on the HAT.



- In comparing the response from the November survey to the most recent one, it should be noted that we have changed the 'neither agree nor disagree' category to 'don't know' in order to bring the response categories in line with the Ofsted ones. As a result, there is a chance that, at least initially, this will make comparisons less reliable, as a parent who may have previously answered 'neither agree nor disagree' may now feel they have to opt for either 'agree' or 'disagree' to express an opinion, as 'don't know' implies they do not have an opinion on the statement. Whether these are more likely to result in positive or negative responses is not certain
- Overall, the trend in comparing the current survey to November's is that the positive response figures show some increases (3 questions), most remaining broadly similar (8 questions) and a few decreases (3 questions)
- Negative responses are higher for all questions with increases between 7% and 30%. The largest increases in negative responses seem to correlate with
 those questions where positive responses fell, indicating a genuine shift in opinion here. However, those questions that saw an increase in positive
 responses also saw increases in negative ones, suggesting that many of those parents/carers who may have selected 'neither agree nor disagree'
 previously are now moving to either positive or negative responses
- The questions with an increase in positive responses are those on SEND support (question 9 up 13%), 'my child does well...' (question 11 up 9%) and being informed about progress (question 12 up 18%)
- The questions with a significant decrease in positive responses and increases in negative responses are those on behaviour (question 4 positive down 16%; negative up 30%), dealing with concerns (question 7 positive down 7%; negative up 16%) and personal development (question 15 positive down 5%; negative up 23%) these responses are the ones that will require the most focus going forward, given the fact that the trend is clearly from the positive towards the negative. Other questions which saw increases of over 10% in negative responses, but where positive responses remained broadly similar or increased are: question 6 (aware of learning negative up 14%), question 9 (SEND support negative up 12%), question 10 (expectations negative up 19%), question 11 (my child does well... negative up 12%) and question 16 (recommend the school negative up 10%) these responses may simply reflect a move of a number of previous 'neither agree nor disagree' respondents towards the negative, and so, while still an area for focus, may end up representing a truer picture of opinion, at least in comparison to the Ofsted survey
- Comparison of the June survey to Ofsted data shows Hinchingbrooke results below both the national and East of England figures for most questions, particularly question 4 (behaviour), question 6 (aware of learning), question 9 (SEND support), question 10 (expectations), question 12 (being informed about progress) and question 15 (personal development)
- Questions where the survey results were most similar to the national and local picture were question 2 ('my child is happy at this school'), question 3 ('my child feels safe at this school') and question 14 (extra-curricular activities)
- It is worth noting for all the points made in this analysis, that the current survey was returned by only 77 parents and so represents only a small minority of the overall cohort and that the current survey was carried out at the end of the school year, whereas the national and East of England Ofsted data is likely to represent a greater proportion of parents and opinion from a range of points across the school year, so any comparisons with the June 2022 results are not like-for-like
