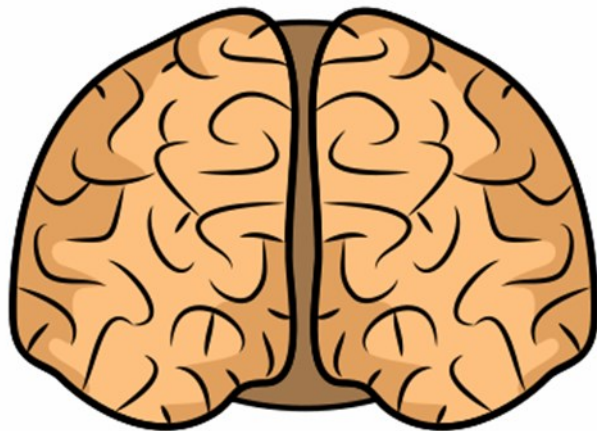
### Using Your Head!
