Message from Mrs Rix, Head of Sixth Form:

On GCSE results day you will need to let us know if you wish to take up your conditional offer for a place at Hinchingbrooke Sixth Form. Below is some FAQs regarding the process that we went through on the Taster Days.



How do I accept my place once I have my results?

The process for accepting your place for Hinchingbrooke students and students from other schools is the same. Results day this year is the **24th of August.** If you are successful in attaining our entrance requirements (5 x grade 5 or above including maths and English; or 5 x grade 5 or above with maths and/or English at a grade 4) you must accept your place to study with us via link to a Microsoft Form which will appear on our school website. Students who are not currently at Hinchingbrooke will be required to email us a copy of their results to

<u>sixthform@hbk.acesmat.uk</u>. We will be checking through all these emails to ensure that you have the right grades to join our Sixth Form.

YOU MUST ACCEPT YOUR PLACE BY 8AM ON 25TH AUGUST

How do I change one or more courses once I have recieved my results?

If you would like to change one or more of your courses after you receive your results, you still have to accept your place by 8am on the 25th of August via the link on the website. You are then invited to come to school, via the Gatehouse, on the 25th of August between 10am and 2pm to change your options. We will do our best to accommodate any changes, but this will be subject to availability on the course and the course fitting the option blocking.

<u>What if I do not meet the entry requirements for one more courses, but still qualify to join the Sixth Form?</u> If you *do not* meet the subject specific entrance requirement (s), but do make the threshold to join Sixth Form, please accept your place via the link on the website. You are then invited to come to school via the Gatehouse, on the **25th of August between 10am and 2pm** to change your options. We will do our best to accommodate any changes, but this will be subject to availability on the course and the course fitting the option blocking. If you come to see on the **25th August from a school other than Hinchingbrooke, please have a photo/copy of your results to show us.**

What do I do if I cannot come into school on 25th August, but I want/need to change my subjects?

If you are not able to come along on the 25th August and would like to/have been asked to change a subject, please email us at sixthform@hbk.acesmat.uk. We will look at these emails after 2.00pm on Friday 25th August and do our best to accommodate any changes you would like to make.

Start of Term

We are really looking forward to welcoming you to Hinchingbrooke Sixth Form. Here is a brief outline of what will be going on at the start of term.

Thursday 7 th	You will be with your tutor for Periods 1 and 2 and lessons will		
September	begin Period 3.		

* These meetings are the first of many you will have with your tutor, and we believe that the relationship that you build with your tutor is essential to your progress at Sixth Form. The 1:1 will cover a variety of things and the tutors will have a copy of your application to chat with you about. You can talk about anything you want and let them know of any concerns/issues you feel the school should be aware of.

Life as a Sixth Former

In Sixth Form you will have more independence and it is therefore you can plan your time to ensure you progress to your potential.

Tutor time

During the Induction period (which is the first half terml) Year 12 form time runs everyday from 8.40 – 9am. In these sessions you will cover a variety of topics. This will also be a chance for you to have a daily check-in with your tutor to discuss how your subjects are going, how you are finding the transition to Sixth Form and any other concerns you have. Sixth Formers do not have PM registration and after the Induction period, form times are once per week for most students.

Additionally to group tutor times you will have at least one small-group/individual meeting once a half term with your tutor to discuss your progress in Sixth Form. These meetings are designed to give you personalised support during your time here with us at Hinchingbrooke Sixth Form. The

frequency of these meetings are tailored around the student's needs so you may find you meet your tutor more freqently at some times and they are always available to meet on request.

<u>Timetable</u>

In Sixth Form your timetable will look different to that of a Year 11 student.

- You will have nine lessons across the fortnight in each of your main subjects (we have a two-week timetable).
- If you have chosen to complete the Core Maths or EPQ qualifications you will also have additional lessons for these.
- You will also have 8 Private Study sessions; these are sessions for completing supervised independent study.
- Every Wednesday period 5 we have our enrichment lessons during these sessions you will choose an activity to enrich your curriculum.


All of the above sessions and tutor times/meetings are compulsory. However, you will be left with some 'non-contact' periods on your timetable. During these times you we strongly recommend thesat you continue with your studies but we do allow students to go leave the school site if you have the ability to. Please ensure you swipe out at reception when you leave the school site.

The Facilities

Hinchingbrooke House

The Sixth Form is based in the House but lessons take place in departments all around the school site. In the House we have several different spaces for you to use.

- Silent space: the Montagu and History rooms (upstairs) and the Library (downstairs). You will be timetabled in these areas for Private Study sessions but are welcome to use it whenever you would like. T
- Quiet space: the Inner Hall and Entrance Hall are for group/paired study.
- Social space: the Old Dining Room and the Sandwich Room (Locker Room) are our social areas



Joe's Café
