Science Talk - Thursday 10th October

Hinchingbrooke School Science Department is pleased to announce the inaugural Science Society talk on Thursday 10th October at 7.00pm in the Hinchingbrooke House Library.

The visiting speaker is Dr Cahir O'Kane from the Dept of Genetics, University of Cambridge, who will be presenting a talk on genetics. The talk is primarily aimed at year 10 and 11 and A level students. However, anyone with an interest in genetics is welcome to attend.

The title of the talk is "Secrets and flies: seeing ourselves in the fruitfly Drosophila". The fruitfly has been used throughout the 20th century to study many of the basic principles of genetics. It has equivalents of most of our genes, and many of the same cell types, including neurons, muscles, and epidermal cells. The fly can even suffer from similar diseases to humans in some cases, and be used as a model of how human cells function, both in health and disease. The lecture will illustrate how flies can be used, what they are good for, their limitations, and some of the discoveries that have been made about neurodegenerative diseases using flies.

As the talk is being held in Hinchingbrooke House library, places will unfortunately be limited.
